Note from Trustees



During these five short years of existence, Nethrodaya has come a long way in serving the differently abled community. Struggle for recognition, quest for identity, craving for acceptance have been the many battles Nethrodaya has fought and won!

Our small but "hard to achieve" victories came in many forms. The State Government, as a token of acknowledgement of Nethrodaya's work, allotted six grounds of land, in a central area of the city, on 20th of November 2006. This form of unconditional support from the State Government has assured Nethrodaya a permanent residence and a strong foundation, providing us the first permanent base camp from where we can dream differently, for differently abled people and make those dreams a reality for all.

In continuation of our mission to make the differently abled self reliant, we have launched a unique residential service programme that exclusively addresses the rural physically challenged student population. With the larger goal of developing this institution as a social enterprise, this in-house living arrangement of the visually and physically challenged together, has resulted in a healthy give and take relationship, where each one enjoys the company of the other in the various day-to-day activities like assisting in reading, writing, guiding in travel, etc.

To enhance the skills of the visually challenged, Nethrodaya has launched a first of its kind, user friendly browsing center with user supportive technology which offers unlimited high speed browsing access for the visually challenged free of charge. This enables them to access e-books, send email, chat and be a part of the IT revolution.

Our Plan for the year 2007-08

To establish a center for Excellence with all the state of the art facilities in the land allotted by the Government of Tamilnadu.

We plan to set up a post-discharge care unit for the visually challenged who are critically injured or ailing, enabling them to have a complete recovery under expert medical supervision until they return home. In the absence of this post-discharge care unit, the visually challenged patients from rural areas find it extremely difficult to shuttle between the village and the city hospital for follow-up treatment.

A unique shop is planned to retail exclusive items such as mobility aids, watches, software, educational items, playing aids, etc.

Last but not the least, the new premises will have an exclusive separate section for the differently abled aged.

We conclude this note with an appeal to our beloved donors to continue the unconditional support to identify, acknowledge, accept and encourage the potential of the differently abled and make Nethrodaya visible to your friends and well wishers.

Nethradhenu

How does a visually impaired villager earn a living?

Nethradhenu is a Nethrodaya programme that reaches out to the visually impaired villagers who are dependent on their families for survival. The scheme offers the dependent villager a cow as their source of income making the individual independent, self-confident and responsible. So far 10 people have benefitted from this scheme. Nethrodaya believes that Nethradhenu is a small first step towards empowering the beneficiaries to build a social enterprise out of this small activity.

Jyothir Bhavan - Home for College Students

Where does a bright but blind student, burning with the fire to excel at college go?

Nethrodaya's answer is Jyothir Bhavan, "the house of light". This user-friendly hostel for the poor, visually impaired college going student is the first of its kind in the state of Tamilnadu. Here, students with satisfactory academic credentials from all over Tamilnadu receive all the support they need to pursue their education.



Free Boarding and Lodging

With the valuable contributions of people from all walks of life, Nethrodaya is able to provide free nutritious food and free quality accommodation during the entire tenure of their stay.



A Well-Coordinated Reader Service

Numerous volunteers contribute time and read lessons for the visually impaired students. Volunteers also record lessons on tape for repeated use by students.



Expert Instruction In Yoga

Once a week, a qualified instructor comes to Nethrodaya and teaches residents simple yoga techniques that help them stay refreshed and healthy.

Part Time Computer Course

Nethrodaya has initiated a unique Part-Time Diploma Course for the visually impaired. So far around 100 students have benefitted from this course.

Spoken English

Qualified instructors conduct regular spoken English classes to enhance their fluency in English, for the students at Nethrodaya.



Interface with achievers:

Nethrodaya organizes monthly interaction meets with visually impaired achievers in order to motivate the inmates.

In addition, visually impaired students, who come to Chennai for entrance exams and selection interviews, are welcome at Nethrodaya for short stays.

So far 210 persons have availed these services and the current strength of Jyothir Bhavan residential home is 45.

Supporting the Education of Children with Visually Impaired Parents

How to improve the standard of the lives of the children of visually impaired parents?

Nethrodaya believes that the impairment of the parents should not impair the future of the normal children. Accordingly, Nethrodaya gives children of blind families active support in receiving a good education. Under this project, 143 children of visually impaired parents have got educational support.



Rehabilitating those Involved in Begging

Begging very often becomes the default occupation of the visually impaired because nobody shows them alternatives. Nethrodaya addresses this aspect by investing time and resources to find them a viable work alternative.

Financial Assistance for Business

How do you help the visually impaired earn their bread?

A grant of marketable goods, worth as little as Rs. 500/-, can set a visually impaired person on the path of economic self-reliance. By providing this seed money, Nethrodaya has given several visually impaired people the power to earn a living. Under this scheme 199 visually impaired persons have obtained financial assistance.

Shelter for the Shelter-less

Nethrodaya is committed to help the homeless visually impaired find a home. To do that, Nethrodaya finds a house, pays the advance money and hands over the key to the visually impaired. This project has benefited 33 visually impaired families.

Health Helpline

Who should come to the rescue of the visually impaired when they need medical help?

When an accident or illness upsets the well being of the visually impaired, Nethrodaya rushes in with all possible assistance to ensure that health is restored. Nethrodaya also organizes medical camps for the visually impaired. This programme has benefited 79 visually impaired persons so far.

To foster community living among the Nethrodaya residents, the organization celebrates birthdays of all the residents in some special way.



Donors' Speak

According to Mr.Dinesh of Kovai Pazhamuthir Nilayam, Annanagar, who has been involved in the growth of the organization, "It's not about one-time charity. The main reason why I'm involved is because the organization helps the students to develop their skills, and enables them to be self employed and independent. The purpose is great and the initiative is good."

A donor who prefers to remain unnamed said, "I have complete faith in Gopi and his ability to manage Nethrodaya. The reason why I help them again and again is that I'm sure that the money will be spent for the purpose it is intended for."

Capt. Shibu, M.D. of Force 1 Guarding Services who has been a long time supporter said, "The uniqueness of the institution is that it is managed by a person who himself is visually impaired. Unlike an able bodied person running an organization for persons with disability, this is by someone who has experienced the same disability. I wish more such persons like Gopi would come forward to start similar organizations."

Former Residents Speak

"Sir, I'm Chellamuthu. I'm working as a 10th Std. teacher at Government High School, Kulathoor, Ramanathapuram. I'm from a rural area. While I was staying at Nethrodaya, in addition to good food and a place to stay, I got all the required support to complete my studies.

The organization is helping visually impaired people seeking aims in the train by providing financial assistance. The organization is reaching out to these people to enable them to set up small business, so that they can be independent."

A heartfelt thank you comes from Muthuswamy; "My name is Muthuswamy. I'm a vendor in the Chennai-Arakkonam route suburban trains. I work from 10 am to 10 pm. Nethrodaya provided me with financial support to start my business. They are providing Medical assistance through their Helpline Project. They are also providing fee support. For the past three years Nethrodaya has been paying fees for both my children. But for Nethrodaya, I don't know what my future would have been. They also provide House Rent and Advance for more than 75 people like me. Nethrodaya is really a God's gift".

According to Mrs. Geetha Umesh, Principal of Gracepark Convent Matriculation school, Thirunainarcoor, "Both the daughters of Mr. Murugesan (a visually impaired beneficiary of Nethrodaya) are studying in my school. They take extra care and interest in the children's studies. In fact they are Role Models for other parents. For Sports Day or other School celebrations they are the ones to get the children ready ahead of other sighted parents. I often quote them while speaking to other parents".

A former student Mr.Ramamurthy said, "It's an Educational Center. They provide good stay and food. They share lots of information for our studies. I got unlimited access to resources towards my studies. Without Nethrodaya it would have been very difficult to complete my course, I would have ended up spending lots of money for the same".

Mr.Janakiraman, another former student said, "Stay at Nethrodaya was very useful and helpful. Though I have stayed in different hostels, this hostel is very different because students here are very disciplined".
