When the time came for my project work, I returned to the suffering of the visually impaired. The survey I did about the blind on Chennai's suburban trains was an eye opener. I resolved to do something about this problem that the affected as well as society had come to accept as inevitable.

Residents of Nethrodaya presented a light music programme. Shri Unni Menon and Shri Jolly Abraham regaled the gathering with popular songs. The climax though was scripted by music director Deva, with his "Oonam, oonam, yaar oonam" song, as he drove home the message that disability is in the spirit and not in the body.

**Play Time:** On March 16, 2003, a volleyball tournament was sponsored by the Social Service Society, Avadi, was held for the blind. In contention for the trophy were Poonamallee Blind School, College Students Association of the Blind, Darshini, Loyola College and Nethrodaya. While Loyola College finished runner-up, Nethrodaya took home the trophy. Cheering the players were Ms. Jennifer Arul, Correspondent, NDTV, Shrimati Lalitha Srivastav, Secretary of the Social Service Society, Avadi, and Ms. Pallavi, animal rights activist.

**Health is Wealth:** On July 12, 2003, with the generous support of the Madras Medical Mission, Nethrodaya organised a camp for the blind, inaugurated by Commodore R S Vasan. To provide all details in emergencies, blood groups were identified for 175 participants and identity cards issued. Medicines for common ailments were also distributed.

Dr. Philomina Mariadoss and Dr. Sai Babu from the Madras Medical Mission were guests of honour.

## STRIKING A CHORD

With demand for Nethrodaya's services growing, we had to mobilise funds. Thus was born Sai Nethrodaya a set of 14 bhajans offered at the lotus feet of Bhagawan Sri Satya Sai Baba by his devotees. Produced by the Sai Kriti & Literature Trust, 1000 copies of the audiocassette were sold, bringing in much needed funds for Nethrodaya.
